



**June 2004
(Meeting)**

- Identify the primary issues that confront the increased sharing of justice information in Illinois.
- Complete the Breakdown of 28 C.F.R. part 20 for Global.
- Publish “Privacy Schmirivacy?”

**July-August
2004**

- Conduct research necessary to address the primary privacy issues.
- Investigate possible **short-term projects** designed to resolve some less significant information sharing issues.
- Complete background research into offender-based justice information systems and their policies.

**Sept. 2004
(Meeting)**

- Complete overviews of the remaining offender-based justice information systems
 - IDOC’s Offender Tracking System;
 - AOIC’s POLARIS; and
 - Chicago Police Dep’t & Illinois State Police I-CLEAR initiative
- Review these system’s implementation of the FIPs and evaluate the privacy implications of the information sharing taking place.

October 2004

- Conduct background research into the accessibility of victim and witness information throughout the justice system, including disclosures of the information within the justice system and to the public.
- Begin drafting an outline of the IIJIS Privacy Policy (Adult justice information only)

**Nov. 2004
(Meeting)**

- Review the collection, use and dissemination of victim and witness information by the justice enterprise.
 - Exam what information is collected, how the information is used, and who has access to it.
 - Determine whether the collection of victim and witness information changes the desirability of implementing the FIP where they may not otherwise be applied.
- Present a draft outline of the IIJIS Privacy Policy regulating adult justice information for review and comment.
 - Get feedback from committee members and make revisions to the outline.
 - Gain consensus on content of the IIJIS Privacy Policy.

**Dec. 2004 –
– Feb. 2005**

- Continue research on how to address the privacy issues.
- Begin drafting language for inclusion into the IIJIS Privacy Policy.
- Conduct legal research so that the IIJIS Privacy Policy incorporates relevant statutes.

**March 2005
(Meeting)**

- Review draft language for the IIJIS Privacy Policy
 - Get feedback from committee members for incorporation into the final IIJIS Privacy Policy

**April - May
2005**

- Complete the final draft of the IIJIS Privacy Policy for Subcommittee approval. (Adult justice information only)

June 2005

- Approve the final version of the IIJIS Privacy Policy for presentation to the IIJIS Implementation Board.
- Introduce intelligence gathering and juvenile justice information as the next topics to be addressed by the Subcommittee.

Short-term projects to be completed by June 2005

1. Comparison of Unofficial and Official Sources of Criminal History Record Information in Illinois
2. Address whether additional training is required regarding the statutory requirements to disclose certain information to the media pursuant to the State Records Act, 5 ILCS 160/4a.
3. Identify the types of information contained in typical criminal case files maintained by circuit court clerks offices.
4. Explore the potential need to amend the Probation and Probation Officers Act, 730 ILCS 110/ *et seq.* to allow the disclosure of officer safety information from probation files.
